Dear Partner Institution:

Department of Defense (DoD) Voluntary Education is pleased to announce a call for new degree program applications to become a part of the Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges (SOC) Degree Network System (DNS). In response to extensive input from the Services, DoD launched an effort to make the DNS more reflective of high-demand occupations and workforce trends. Accordingly, SOC is actively reviewing degree programs for network development in an array of emerging career fields.

For 30+ years SOC has maintained a DNS on behalf of the DoD. The SOC DNS consists of degree-granting colleges and universities that have adopted policies outlined in the Voluntary Education Partnership Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to help Service members and their adult family members earn college degrees. Many courses offered by DNS participating institutions have two-way guaranteed transferability, making it easier for Service members to complete associate and bachelor's degrees no matter where they move during their military careers.

The enclosure shares the long-term plan for developing new networks and rollout dates so that institutions can submit applications for DNS participation. Several existing networks will be strengthened by adding institutions. DoD seeks to integrate roughly twenty of the best-aligned programs in each of these areas.

As you prepare to submit your degree programs for possible inclusion in the proposed networks, we encourage institutions to review and consider a commitment to the SOC Membership Criteria page at <http://www.soc.aascu.org/socdns/DNSMember.html> - membership. A key focus in our selection of programs will continue to be guaranteed transferability as it is a core feature of the SOC DNS.
